

#### **January 24 Committee Meeting**

The Branch 66 committee met on January 24 and covered many agenda items in the two hours. Below are some salient points from the meeting.

The committee reviewed the application by Graham Wilson ZL1CE to join Branch 66 and voted unanimously to recommend to the next general meeting that Graham's application be accepted.

The committee decided not to have a stand at any junk sales in 2023 except possibly for local junk sales. The profit the branch makes from junk sales has dwindled over the last few years and it is now difficult to justify the cost and time of attending most junk sales.

The Trading Table will be advertised more.

The branch is short of net controllers for the Sunday Night News and Net. If you would like to be a net controller for even just one night, please email a member of the committee.

#### Stepping down

When I commenced the position of vice-president at last year's AGM, I assumed there would be a president and a secretary. My assumption was incorrect and I have been serving the three roles of president, vice-president and secretary. I said at the committee meeting on January 24 that I would continue in this triple role until the next AGM. An increase in my family commitments means I will be stepping down from the three roles at the end of March.

#### Lack of volunteers

As illustrated by the lack of president, secretary and net controllers, the branch is having difficulty getting people to assume the volunteer roles required to run the branch and its activities. This lack of volunteers is not peculiar to Branch 66 and not even peculiar to amateur radio.

I have discussed the reasons for the lack of volunteers with hams outside the club. The reasons given include the following

Some roles are time consuming. Many hams would rather devote their time to on-the-air activities, homebrewing and related activities, and not to serving as a volunteer for the branch.

Some roles such as the officers of a branch require the officers to assume more legal responsibility than in the past. Many hams are not prepared to assume this increased responsibility.

Some administrative processes are out of date, even antiquated. Such processes do not find favour with many hams.

(This reason is not independent of the three reasons listed above). There is too much emphasis on process and not enough on actions and results. Most hams prefer participating in activities such on-the-air activities and homebrewing and not attending meetings, writing reports and minutes, and completing forms.

Given the above reasons and the lack of volunteers, I recommend Branch 66 reduce the time required for each volunteer role, and modernize and simplify its processes.

Below are some changes the branch could make.

Hold the business part of the general meetings every second meeting and not every meeting. This change would reduce the workload of the president, treasurer and secretary. In addition, a smaller portion of members' time will be spent attending meetings. The justification for the change is that members of the branch do not need to be updated on the business of the club every month.

Replace the agenda for each meeting by draft minutes. This draft is then corrected during the meeting. Branch 02 (Auckland) and Branch 10 (Franklin) use this approach, as does the North West Orienteering Club in Auckland. This way of writing the minutes reduces the secretary's workload and can lead to people who have agenda items being better prepared.

Currently, the club has no time limit for committee meetings and business meetings. My recommendation is to introduce a time limit of one hour for committee meetings and 20 minutes for business meetings. These time limits will reduce the amount of time members spend attending meetings.

#### **Introducing the New Spectrum Editor**

My name is Mark Howie, ZL1UMK. I have recently taken over as the editor of Spectrum.

I thought it might be helpful to introduce myself.

I got my ham license in October 2002. This was largely at the suggestion of my brother-in-law Brian Wilson, ZL1UXB.

I believe we both attended a Ham Study Course held at Branch 29.

At the time I was living at Snell's Beach, north of Auckland.

My early mentors were Mike Ryan, ZL2MR; & Irving Spackman ZL1AB (if I recall his call-sign correctly).

Both Mike & Irving were leading members of the Rodney Amateur Radio Club – Branch 71. After I moved on from Snell's Beach I lost touch with both Mike and Irving, and I suspect both are now Silent Keys.

As a club we were connected with the then, Rodney District Council in the AREC, Emergency Communications Role. I believe I attended at least one AREC training course.

Around this time I was also briefly involved with the local Coastguard unit, and studied and passed the Restricted Radiotelephone Operator's Certificate (Marine VHF).

One of the first radios I used was a Yaesu (Vertex Standard) VX-150 handheld, lent to me by Brian ZL1UXB. I also have an Icom 720A HF rig, which is now in storage, but I don't believe I have ever used it. I also have an Icom 228H (Mobile 2m), which was installed in my car for a number of

years. I recall using it via the Klondyke (146.625 MHz) repeater to talk from St Heliers to Brian ZL1UXB, who was working in central Hamilton.

More recently I bought a second-hand Yaesu FT-60 (Handheld 2m\70cm) from eBay from the USA, and appreciated it's ability to also receive the VHF Aviation band.

I also have a Kenwood TM-721A (Mobile 2m\70cm) which I have used a little in my car.

I also have two Baofeng UV-82s (Handheld 2m\70cm) which I lent briefly to my nephews JohnHenry Wilson (ZL1JHW) and Peter Wilson (ZL1SPG). My nephew Samuel Wilson also has a ham license. (ZL2RDX).

I have also used CHIRP to programmed Brian's Kenwood THG-71.

Very recently I bought a TYT MD-390 (Handheld DMR VHF\UHF). I'm currently learning to configure it and to connect with it.

I am not a frequent user of my radios.

In 1981 I began studying at ATI towards NZCE Telecom. One of my classmates was Simon Watt-Wyness (ZL1SWW). Although I suspect he may not remember me.

I have worked in a number of technology roles. From about 1982 to 1985, I worked in the mail-order department of Dick Smith Electronics. From 1985 to 1996 I worked as a Video Editor for TVNZ in Auckland. In 1996 I moved to Snell's Beach to work as a Video Editor for Family Television Network (FTN) a local television station. I left FTN in about 2003, and moved back to Auckland. I worked for Vending Direct, initially assembling a locally made (Retro) machine. In 2006 with the introduction of the new coins, I was involved in programming coin recognition mechanisms (coin mechs), used in vending machines. Next, I did a couple of study courses on Computers, and have Microsoft Office 2007 and Server 2003 certifications. In about 2010 I joined Insite Technology (a division of Renaissance), working assembling Laptops, Desktops, All-in-one computers and Servers. The highlight was building an Intel Modular Server.

In 2012 I worked briefly in the Telstra Clear Call Centre dealing with ADSL Broadband, Landline, Mobile and Fibre delivered Cable Television, queries.

I have also worked as a contract computer technician; doing user support at the Fonterra Head Office, and desktop computer replacement projects for the Fire Service, QV, and WINZ. I also did a project replacing Point of Sale computers in numerous Countdown supermarkets from the Bay of Islands to Dunedin.

More recently I worked for Vending Direct, refurbishing and configuring Vending Machines.

I have just begun a new position as a Technician for GVC, working at Auckland Airport. This involves fibre and copper patching, and likely a VOIP phone rollout project.

I was elected onto the committee of Branch 66 at the end of 2020, giving up the role to take on the position of Spectrum Editor, late last year.

My favourite amateur related activity, is using CHIRP or similar to programme radios.

Outside of Ham radio I enjoy messing about with computers. I have quite a number of TradeMe sourced Servers, Network Switches and related gear. I also enjoy reading for pleasure.

I also am an active member of the C3 church at Ellerslie.




